

The Spis castle – the largest castle complex in Central Europe


18 urban heritage areas: including Košice, Kežmarok, Kremnica, Levoča, Banská Bystrica, Trnava, Nitra and many others

About 180 registered and protected castles and ruins

THE TATRA CHAMOIS

You will not find this kind anywhere else in the World

A completely unique chamois kind which differs from its related chamois in the Alps or Apennines

Sometimes one can see this unique animal while tracking in the mountains.



SPAS AND MINERAL SPRINGS

Almost 1500 mineral springs in Slovakia

23 Health Spas providing curative power of thermal springs, mud and unique climatic conditions

The water with similar composition as in Spa Dudince can be found only in the well known french Spa Vichy and in Japan



OCHTINSKA ARAGONITOVA JASKYNA CAVE

The only one of its type in Europe

One of the three accessed caves of its type in the world (Mexico, Argentina)

UNESCO Heritage

In Slovakia there are 12 caves open to the public




THE WORLD HIGHEST WOODEN GOTHIC ALTAR

Situated in the St. James Church in Levoča

18,6 m high altar was carved of lime wood at the beginning of 16th century

The author is Master Pavol of Levoča and the work took him 10 years




ST. ELISABETH'S CATHEDRAL IN KOSICE

Situated in Košice – Gem of the East Slovakia

The most eastern situated western-type cathedral in Europe

The largest European set of 48 Gothic table paintings




KREMNICA MINT

The oldest enterprise in the world which operates without any break

The coins have been made here since 1328

Euro-coins will be stamped here as well



THE PARACHUTE

The inventor of the parachute was the Slovak Štefan Banič (1870-1941)

He tested his invention in USA, 1914

The parachute later belonged to the standard equipment of the US Army during World War I.



ANDY WARHOL POP ART MUSEUM

Situated in the Eastern part of Slovakia – in town Medzilaborce

The only one museum of its type in Europe

Founded as the first in the world in 1991




THE WOODEN CHURCHES

3 types – Gothic wooden churches, "articled" churches, Greek Catholic

Almost 30 wooden churches situated mostly in the eastern Slovakia

Built without using any nails or metal materials
